Secondly, we can create a mix of our favorite flowers. For the bees the diversity is important. It is important that there are many different species and that they bloom all over the year. There are a lot of great bee-friendly plants and flowers which are common in gardens. These flowers will not only make the garden brighter and more beautiful, but will also become the source of pollen and nectar for bees.

Oregano (Origanum Vulgare)



Thyme (Thymus)



Borage (Borago)
